

# Transfer Options



## By bus

- the drivers of the airport buses
- all metro and blue ticket offices

The bus that connects the Athens Airport with Alimos Marina is X96 Express Piraeus-Airport. You can board the bus at the arrivals terminal (see the yellow marked area on the chart).

The stop for our base in Alimos Marina is 1st Kalamakiou. For a timetable and a list of the bus stops [click here](#) (make sure you choose the route from the Airport to Piraeus - Departure from end point) .



## By taxi

Alternatively, you can take a taxi in order to get to the marina. You can find them lined up right outside the arrival area. The ride should take about 35- 45 minutes.

If you prefer, you can ask us to book a taxi for you. Our driver will be waiting for you inside the arrival area holding a sign with your name.

## By minivan

# Check-in/out & Provisioning

## Check-in

Our Greek Isles Yachting base personnel will be at pier 7 to welcome you upon arrival. You will be given a comprehensive and detailed inventory of the yacht delineating clearly where everything is. Together with that you will receive a condensed manual with info and tips. The idea is to give you the chance to familiarize yourself with the yacht at your own pace. You will also be given a diver's report and a hull damage report from the previous charter, which you should check. When you are ready, a member of our staff will come over to continue the technical orientation with you. They will go over the motor and sails operation with you, answer any questions you may have and of course give you itinerary information and make suggestions, if you wish. The check-in usually takes between 1 or 2 hours.

## Check-out

The check-out usually takes place the last evening before disembarkation. It is kindly requested to be back in the home port by 18:00 the day before the end of your charter. A member of our staff will be there to help you moor upon your return. Please inform us a couple of hours prior to your arrival at our base. Do inform our base staff of any problems you may have encountered and let us know if anything was lost or damaged. This way you are helping us ensure that everything can be handled for the next charter in a timely manner. A diver will inspect the hull of the yacht and issue a report. Please bear in mind that the yacht will also need to be refueled. The check-out procedure will take up to an hour.

Would you like to pre-order your provisions and have them delivered to your yacht upon your arrival, without any extra charge? Let us know and we will send you available options


## Supermarket near the marina

If on the other hand if you prefer to do your shopping on your own, there is a Sklavenitis supermarket located less than 500m from the marina. Just across the street from the main marina entrance (see aerial photo on page 5 below) .

## Provisions on Sunday

All supermarkets in Athens are closed on Sunday. A minivan service from Balaskas delicatessen is available on Sundays to pick you up from the marina (without extra charge) take you to the shop to do your shopping and deliver everything back to the yacht.

## Things to do in Athens




If you happen to have some free time and the desire to explore Athens, these are a few of our suggestions:

Anyone will tell you if there is one thing you must see in Athens that's the **new Acropolis Museum**. Built above the byzantine ruins of the city (visible through a glass floor), the museum expands on three levels with three different themes: the slopes of the Acropolis, the Archaic period (7th century-480 BC) and excavations and preservations on Acropolis monuments. Depending on how much time you have, the visit up the hill to the monument itself is also a must.

**Dionysiou Areopagitou - Apostolou Pavlou street:** this cobblestone pedestrian street offers one of the most beautiful walks in the city under the hill of the Acropolis, especially at dusk. Adorned with rows of neoclassical buildings, the road passes by the Acropolis Museum and the **Odeon of Herodes Atticus** where many of the **Athens Festival** events take place, and leads you to **Thission** with its plethora of outdoor cafés and ouzeris.

**Anafiotika** is a hidden gem. Carved into the northeast side of the hill of Acropolis, built by masons from the island of Anafi, this quite, residential neighborhood is a cycladic microcosm in the heart of Athens.



### The changing of the Guard in Syntagma Square:

The imposing Evzones of the Presidential Guard who stand in front of the Parliament with their traditional attire attract many spectators. The ceremonial change of guard takes place every Sunday at 11:00. However, you can also catch a less formal change everyday on the hour.



A stroll around the districts of **Plaka**, **Thission**, **Monastiraki** will offer you the most wonderful pastime. Explore the ancient monuments, admire the beautiful byzantine churches and lose yourself in narrow alleyways with neoclassical houses and flower filled patios.

### The Tower of the Winds:

This beautiful octagonal building, located in the **Roman Agora in Plaka**, was built by astronomer Andronicus in about 50 BC. It once operated as a solar clock and is considered the oldest surviving meteorological station.

Each of its sides depicts one of the eight winds. On top, a bronze wind vane depicting the sea god Triton once stood, rotating as the winds changed.





In **Andrianou** and **Pandrossou street** you can shop anything from leather sandals, greek handicrafts and traditional musical instruments to fine jewelry, art, vintage accessories and tourist souvenirs. In **Avissinias square** search for antiques.

These neighborhoods are filled with sidewalk cafes, ouzeri and tavernas, so the opportunities for a laid-back break over a cold beer and “mezedes” will be plenty.

Especially in Monastiraki mind your belongings and be aware of pick-pockets.



At the end of the day have a **cocktail with the Parthenon almost at arms length** at one of the best situated roof bars. Either A for Athens or 360° in Monastiraki square will offer you a breathtaking view and imaginative cocktails, but you should be aware that they are usually quite crowded.




